Notes of Interest

Signage for the **Shire Country Park** has been completed at Trittiford, Chinn Brook Meadows and Chinn Brook Nature reserve. The format is intended to be used in the rest of the Park, including compatibility within **Moseley Bog**, now under the care of The Wildlife Trust where contractors are currently laying paths and new boardwalks. The work is due to finish by the end of February. The area then has spring to regenerate undergrowth and give peace to nesting creatures.

The **John Morris Jones Walkway** Group is now in action.

It is hoped that the bridge over the ford **near Greet Mill Meadows** will be painted soon. Funding has been found for equipment for volunteers to use on training days. Workdays will be shown in future newsletters.

Burbury Brickworks workdays continue. Lookout for workdays and events at this location and support them if you can. Section 106 money is imminent for site improvement to paths and entrances.

Blackberry Way has obtained some 106 money for funding entrance and path improvements. Work continues on thinning the plantations.

Priory Fields does not have a Friend's Group and unfortunately there was no response to an open day. This is a great pity since this a uniquely diverse site with the only heath land habitat in the area. Should any members of Shire Country Friends know of contacts that might be interested let the Rangers know.

River Cole

The metal from the sluice gates has been stolen (again). Scrap iron has increased a lot in value recently so keep watch.

Work along the walkway is about to start. The gate from the BMX site (now known as Chinn Brook Nature Reserve) is to be relocated to Scribers Lane. The old Slade Lane scrap yard is still to be purchased the strip of land at the rear down to the river has been bought. This last is a result of the 1980's strategy to have no private land on the corridor.

Because of the re-arrangement of the Rangers, now based at Kings Heath Park it is more important than ever for Friends and Conservation Groups to monitor the areas and send in comments and reports about conservation problems. 0121 464 8728
